Burglaries tend to happen during the day.

Surveillance cameras are helpful for BPD, so share footage with them if you have/get it.

Continue to keep an eye out and call police if you see anything suspicious or are the victim of a crime.

If you see finger prints, notify the responding officer so prints can be taken.

- "Get Alarmed" Program is providing residents with a free smoke detector. Contact the Birmingham Fire and Rescue Service Department's Fire Prevention Bureau at 250-7540 or call the Department's Public Education Bureau at 785-1332

- Fire hydrant flushing in the area is now complete. Note that sometimes flushing hydrants will send sediment into homes, so try to avoid washing clothes during flushings.

- DO NOT PAINT FIRE HYDRANTS. Some are being repainted now, and different colors tell firefighters about flow rates and other details.

- Park as close to curbs as possible when street parking to allow fire trucks to pass more easily.

- Summer Safety Tips:
 - Check on neighbors and stay hydrated
 - Be Careful when cooking out
 - Burn Ban is currently in effect

- 2 trees at Virginia Samford Theater have been removed and stumps waiting to be ground up (stump grinder broke down so this is in the works)

- Three trees in front of Rojo/O'Henry's have been trimmed, two to be removed

- update on hill below Highland Drive (across Highland Ave. from golf course) – hydrangeas and azaleas to be planted in the fall

- update on replacement crepe myrtles on Highland Ave. along golf course – city contact to call Alison Glascock to meet and identify where new ones should go

- Vandalism/theft of trees and plants: several trees in the median along Clairmont Ave. between St. Vincents and Bogues were mysteriously cut down (not by the city) and flower beds on Clairmont Ave. across from the Piggly Wiggly have been replanted 5 times because someone continues to steal the plants.

Proposed Variance for townhomes on 30th St. S. (corner of intersection b/w 30th and Rhodes Circle)

- Carter Hughes of H2 Real Estate presented proposed Tudor style townhome design prepared by Nequette Architecture who did extensive research of area buildings to make design fit in with historic area. Estimated price for each home \$500,000 with each having a two car garage in the rear of structures.

- Variance requested is for a 15' setback (where current requirement is 25') (Avg. setback along west side of 30th is 16' and median is 11.5')

- Concerns from residents:

- variance was set for a reason, and if one is granted what prevents others?

- building will be too close to street and will be too tall and block light

- increased traffic and possibly more cars

- Highland Park Planning & Zoning Committee met and voted to approve the variance on 6/12/17

- Vote on variance: Motion to Approve (Bruce Lanier), motion seconded (David Dinehart), 8 for, 2 opposed

- City Planning & Zoning Committee meeting on the issue will be held July 13th, 2017
